Tips for Proper Care of Watercolour Brushes

Taking care of your brushes can save you money and time, and a good quality brush can last a lifetime if you look after it well. Here are some general guidelines which will make sure that all of your brushes last:

When New ...

- □ **Never** try to put the new brush round plastic protector back on.
- □ **Resist** the temptation to "bend" new bristles.
- □ Always wash new brushes before using them.

When Using ...

- □ **Always** wet your brush before picking up paint. <u>Do not</u> pick up paint with a dry brush.
- □ **Never** let paint dry on the brush.
- Always use a low quality or old brush to re-soften dried paint on your palette.
- Avoid submerging a brush beyond the ferrule for extended periods.
- **Never** use a watercolor brush for painting with oils or acrylics.
- □ **Always** protect your brushes when transporting them.

When Cleaning and Storing ...

- □ **Always** clean thoroughly with mild soap and water after each painting session.
- □ Always use tepid or lukewarm water for cleaning. <u>Do not</u> use HOT water.
- □ **Always** shape the tip with your fingers, never with your lips.
- □ Always let brushes dry laying flat or in an open jar with bristles up (never down).
- □ Always dry the handle and ferrule (metal piece that holds the bristles).
- Only store brushes once they are completely dry.
- □ **Always** store laying flat or in an open jar with bristles up.
- **Use** an airtight box if you are storing brushes for a long time.
